Alice Jenkins is Professor of Victorian Literature and Culture at the University of Glasgow. She works mainly on the emergence of the knowledge economy in the nineteenth century. Her publications include Space and the 'March of the Mind': Literature and the Physical Sciences, 1815-1850 (2007) and an edition of Michael Faraday's essays (2008). She has recently completed a book on Victorian ideas about the ultimate unity of knowledge, as well as a cultural history of Euclidean geometry in the nineteenth century, written as part of a three-year project funded by the European Research Council.
